

4-H Horse Program 'Leg Up' Scholarship Application

The Race for Education in conjunction with Kentucky Equine Education Project (KEEP) has developed the Kentucky 4-H Horse Program 'Leg Up' Scholarship. This college scholarship, sponsored by the Race for Education, is awarded to one 4-H horse club student in his/her senior year of high school in each 4-H club in Kentucky. Criteria for this scholarship include financial need, communication skills, leadership, and commitment to the agriculture and equine industry.

The \$250 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating student of each club annually. Students may also be eligible to participate in the Race for Education's Assets for Independence Program and receive an additional \$4,000 in scholarship funding.

To be eligible for this scholarship, a student must;

- be a KY 4-H Horse program student member and active within their KY 4-H Horse chapter;
- currently a High School senior;

Supporting materials that must accompany a completed application and submitted to 4-H Club and county agent by May 22th include:

1. Essay on the following topics: (Maximum of 750 words.);

a. How do you feel your 4-H experience will impact your future/college ambitions?

- b. What has been your most rewarding 4-H experience?
- c. What interests do you have outside the equine industry or chosen career field?

2. Brief description of career goals that addresses the following:

What college major do you plan to focus on? Please describe what steps you will take over the next 5 to 10 years to gain the experience and skills to become an expert in these areas. (Maximum of 750 words.);

3. Current official transcript (seal can be broken);

*All scholarships are \$250 unless recipient qualifies for the Assets for Independence (AFI) Federal grant program available through The Race For Education. If a student meets Federal guidelines and completes the grant program, the student receives the \$250 scholarship for the fall term then as part of the grant program receives an additional \$4,000 in grant funding for their spring term. Extensive information about the program is provided after scholarship recipients are notified of selection committee's decisions in June. The AFI program only open to US residents.
